Ongoing Community Engagement

Positive Results Achieved Through Community Partnership

- Effective compliance to current 'Letter to Airmen' issued on April 25, 2016.
- Jet landings on Runway 1R down significantly YOY in recent months:
 - Corporate jet and Airside A compliance.
 - Deviations monitored and actioned daily.
- Movement of air cargo operators back to the west runway.
- Meetings completed with air carrier Chief Pilots to solicit their compliance.
- Proactive posting of specific deviation data to TampaAirport.com.
- Participation in multiple HOA meetings.
- Increased frequency of CNC meetings throughout 2016.

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Metroplex (NextGen)


Metroplex (NextGen) – Key Facts



- Congressional mandate to the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) to transform the National Airspace System.
- Primary component is implementation of Performance Based Navigation (PBN).
 - Moves away from ground based navigation to satellite based navigation.
- Metroplex implementation began at PHX in 2014.
- Metroplex now complete or in the final implementation stages at:
 - ATL, CLT, DCA/IAD, IAH, DFW, SFO
- Metroplex implementation has:
 - Experienced challenges with the level of communication both to airport operators and communities on proposed and implemented changes by the FAA.
 - Resulted in the reevaluation of engagement efforts for future Metroplex initiatives.
- South-Central Florida implementation (including TPA) currently projected 18-24 months after design phase.
- Majority of NextGen expected to be <u>fully implemented by 2020</u>.

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Noise Office Update


May 1, 2016 – June 30, 2016

Overview

- Total Complaints: 52
- Total Complaints (same period 2015): 104
- Air Cargo Compliance: 98.9%
 (481 of 486 air cargo compliant operations)

Chief Pilot Meetings - Update

- Meetings with United, Spirit, JetBlue and Southwest Airlines Chief Pilot leadership completed.
- For May and June 2016, commercial pilot compliance was 99.94%.



Deviations are for all air carriers which include requests to depart Runway 19L and arrive Runway 1R arrivals.



Year-over-Year Comparison

Proactive Noise Office Efforts:

- Partnership with the FAA.
- Airline and Chief Pilot partnerships.
- Prompt deviation notices.
- Taxiway 'J' (Air Cargo).
- Taxiway 'J' (Weekends).
