The Super Bowl Weekend

- Runway 19L Departures:
 - 24 Commercial Jets (Weekend Total)
 - None on Feb. on 7th
- Runway 1R Landings:
 - 102 Jet aircraft (16 Commercial)
 - Feb. 7th: 9 am 7 pm
- Runway 1L Landings
 - 160 Jet aircraft (158 Commercial)
 - Feb. ^{7th}: 7am Midnight



Runway Closures

- Runway Maintenance:
 - Runway 1L/19R
 - Feb. 12th 7 am 3 pm
 - Mar. 10th 1 pm 4 pm
 - Runway 1R/19L
 - Feb. 22nd 9 pm 8 am
 - Feb. 26th 8 am 10 pm
 - Mar 7th 8 pm thru Mar 8th 6 pm (Continuous closure)



West Runway Closure

- Runway 1L/19R was closed on February 12th 2021.
 - Closed to facilitate multiple runway maintenance items including:
 - Shoulder repair W1 and W2
 - FAA Technical Operations
 - RWY 19R approach lighting Repairs
 - ILS Maintenance
 - Ground Checks




Runway Maintenance





Unexpected Closures

- Runway 1L/19R was temporarily closed on January 24th 2021.
 - Bird strike reported 11:43 am
 - Debris on the runway at 5:30 pm
 - Aircraft landed safely at another airport
- Runway 1L/19R was temporarily closed on February 9th 2021.
 - Centerline light replacement (Required for Low Visibility)



East Runway Closure

- A continuous Runway 1R/19L took place on March 7th through the 8th 2021.
 - Closed to facilitate multiple runway maintenance items including:
 - Joint Sealing
 - Wiring Repair
 - Paint Markings
 - Light Cleaning/Adjustments



Upcoming **Prolonged** 2021/2022 Runway Closures

- Extended closures on **both** parallel runways are tentatively planned for the second half of 2021.
 Dates to be determined and will be communicated once they are finalized:
 - Closures are necessary for re-grading work on the south ends of both parallel runways that cannot be accomplished per regulatory requirements with the runways open to air traffic.
 - Runway closures are expected to last several weeks.





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Noise Exposure Map Update

Noise Exposure Map Update

- The Authority is in the process of formally updating the Airport's Noise Exposure Map.
- This project formally kicked off in late 2019.
- Due to COVID-19, the first round of public outreach was delayed until October 2020.
- A second round of public outreach is planned for late summer 2021.
- The project is currently expected to be completed in late 2021/early 2022.



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Metroplex (NextGen)

Metroplex (NextGen) – Key Facts



- Congressional mandate to the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) to transform the National Airspace System.
- Primary component is implementation of Performance Based Navigation (PBN), moving away from ground based navigation to satellite based navigation.
- South-Central Florida implementation (including TPA) are expected over the next 12 months.
- Majority of NextGen expected to be <u>fully implemented in 2021</u>.





Metroplex Implementation Coming in 2021



- FAA is the agency implementing congressionally mandated modernization of the National Airspace System.
- The FAA completed their second round of public outreach over the summer of 2021:
 - The FAA's Finding of No Significant Impact was formally filed in late
 October 2020
 - Procedure changes will begin in early 2021
 - Majority of changes around TPA are at or above 10,000 ft.







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FAA's Noise Annoyance Survey

Overview

- As part of FAA's ongoing research program on aircraft noise, the Agency conducted a nationwide survey regarding annoyance related to aircraft noise.
- This survey was conducted in 2015 and 2016.
- The survey was released in early January 2021.
- Survey suggests that noise annoyance occurs at lower noise levels than current federal methodology, in place since the 1970's, accounts for.
- The Noise Annoyance Survey itself will not dictate a change in federal guidelines for noise annoyance and will be coupled with additional research and community engagement.
- There is currently no change to the 65 DNL metric being the baseline for land use compatibility and/or significant noise impact.
- There is a 60 day public comment period on the Federal Register Notice, which closes on March 15, 2021.
